**Call to Order:** Meeting was called to order at 4:04 p.m.

### **Approval of Minutes of February 12, 2019**

**MOTION:** To approve the minutes of February 12, 2019 meeting. Eric moved to approve, Cristy seconded.

### **Current Projects – Status Update:**

**Cudjoe Key Fire Station** – Total Budget: \$ 3.7 million. Art Budget; \$ \$36,300.00 Architect: CPH. Cary Vick is project manager. Non-voting members are Steve Hudson and Kim Workman. Site work and building on schedule. Completion estimated by February 2020. Appears that the foundation is in place. The RFP is still being revised, Liz will forward to Tricia and all committee members once her research is completed and she has the appropriate images for the site. Discussion ensued regarding the validity of an artist's site visit, and whether it would be necessary for this project.

**Marathon Library** – Total Budget: \$6.4 million. Architect: Synalovski, Romanik Saye, Eduardo Diaz & Meryl Romanik. Rob Tudor, project mgr. Michele Franke and Ann Rice are the non-voting members. Selection committee received 4 bids, top ranked bid is on the March 21<sup>st</sup> BOCC meeting agenda for approval. Staff will begin a draft RFP for public art once budget is received.

**Plantation Key Court House** – MM 88.8 - Budget \$28+ million, Architects are CSA and Bill Horn. Non-Voting members are Court Administrator Holly Elomina and Judge Luis Garcia. 100% construction documents complete. Site prep is in process prior to construction. Project manager is Matthew Howard. Staff is moving out of buildings into temp office space and then demo will begin. Work is progressing steadily.

### **New Projects – Status Update:**

**Emergency Operations Center (EOC)** – Total Budget – in process. New EOC will be built at the Marathon Airport – plans include matching grant funding and first step are new Design plans. Once plans are approved and financing secured, building RFP will start bid process. Timeline approximate 2020-2023. Project manager- Cary Vick. The new facility will be built to withstand hurricanes. This project may, or may not, involve public art; in that the monies will not be allocated from County funds. Liz will encourage Cary's attendance at our next meeting to learn more.

### **Other Business**

- FAPAP Conference in Ft. Lauderdale – May 7 -10, Liz and Sue are attending, and Tricia will try to attend. Cristy, Eric and Beth will not be able to attend this year. The conference fee is \$175 per attendee. Topics of this year's conference include conservation & hurricane preparedness, advocacy, and how public art helps to heal a community.
- Florida Keys Sculpture Trail -Beth shared that the necessary paperwork for Fragments in Islamorada has been approved, DOT confirmed that they have received all the necessary materials. The pieces have been moved from Jim Bernardin's to a longer term, but still temporary, location. Beth also shared that the funds to install the sculpture may have to be raised. Discussion then moved to the Pyramid sculpture, which may work well Truman Waterfront Park. Also discussed was the possibility of Old Settler's Park in Key Largo as a potential location.
